





# Strategies to Prevent COVID-19 in Long-Term Care

- RESTRICT visitation
- Communicate with residents & families
- Restrict non-essential HCP
- Educate HPC
- Practice social distancing of residents
- Monitor HCP and residents for fever and symptoms of respiratory infection
- Implement infection prevention and control practices
- Notify health department and other facilities
- Assess inventory and provide necessary supplies


Informs clinicians of new CDC resources and guidance related to emergency preparedness and response. This email is sent as soon as possible after CDC publishes new content.
